First business to come before the meeting was the finalizing of plans for the Spaghetti Dinner to be held at the Neighborhood House on Sunday, March 2, 1980 from 4 to 7 - Tickets for adults \$4.50 - Children \$2.25. Posters have been put out and tickets distributed. Ralph Davis will do the spaghetti and Mr. Herrlin will contact Paul Greenwood to make the meatballs and sauce. Members were asked to contribute toward the expense of the sauce.

Mr. Helm reported that the foof of the Main Hall was in very bad condition and at a point where a new roof was absolutely necessary. Also that he had an approximate price of \$3000 to do the roof with Sealomatics. As for covering the cost - the lIons Club will underwrite it with proceeds from its Barbecue in July. In the meantime the roof must be done and paid for - the Association has a \$5000. bond - Federal Home Loan Banks - due on February 25, 1980.
