Minutes of both the Annual Meeting and the Organization Meeting were read and appoved.

Mrs. Lynn Allen, Treasurer - reported that the present balance was \$15,307.55 in the checking account and \$3,239.28 in the Payroll Account; that our checking account had been transferred to the Suffolk County National Bank and that a Savings Account had been set up for accrual of payroll deposit - as authorized at at the meeting of june 28, 1995; that the Annual Appeal Letter to date had brought in \$12,375.95 and that all contributions had been acknowledged; that the Golf Day at the Maidstone Club took in \$21,600.00 - expenses of \$6,024.00 - leaving a profit of \$\$15,576.00. Detailed copy of the Treasurer's Report was read - accepted - and a copy ordered attached to these minutes - so done,

Mr. Herrlin advised the meeting that the cost of the Golf Day had been set at \$125.00 - that price was changed to \$150.00. The day went off verywell and already there are inquiries about the Annual Day for next October.

Mrs. Allen suggested that it might be a good ideas to set up a budget committee that would come up with a budgetary plan. The suggestion was accepted and a committee will be formed.

Michael Helm, Investments Chairman made the following report on investments as od September 29, 1995:

Detailed report was read - accepted - and ordered attached to these minutes - so done.

Mrs. Green - XR Resident Directors reported the following:

There is no longer evidence of termites in the front entrance lavatories.

The painting at the side entrance has been done.

Mrs. Green brought up the matter of the tables - they are in very bad condition and so righty that they could be classed "dangerous". After discussion it was voted that Mrs. Green be authorized to order twelve (2) tables at a cost of \$125.00...approximately.

Also brought up was the matter of radiator covers - a price has been obtained for five (5) covers at a cost of \$800.00. After discussion discussion it was voted that Mrs. Green be authorized to place the order for the five (5) radiator covers.

Also brought up was the possiblity of having a dumpster in the garage - to be emptied as needed at a price of \$25.00 "an empty". To this points Mrs. Green has been taking care of things to go to the dump and sorting things out. After discussion it was voted that Mrs. Green be authorized to proceed with having a dumpster placed.

There was discussion on the hourly rate of \$15.00 being charged for the use of the Main hall. It was felt that if the hall was being used by someone who charged for a class - aerobics, karate, etc. that the price be raised to \$30.00. If the hall is used for non-profit the charge would be \$20.00 - after discussion motion was amade and seconded that the price of \$30.00 per hour be set for anyone using the space for profit - and a price of \$20.00 per hour for non-profit use.

Mrs. Graham reported for the Nursery Group that twenty-three (23) children attended the morning session and thirteen (13) attended the afternoon session. That the groups had taken several trips to the outside and that things were going along well. There was some discussion discussion about raise the price of attendance - this will be checked into and reported on at a future meeting.

Tony Johnson reported that the proto-type for under the stage storage will be installed on Monday and apologized for it having taken so long - he had been out of town.
