The Association owns and maintains a large two story wood building know locally as "The Neighborhood House". The first floor of the building consists of a large auditorium, with a stage - and is equipped with basketball baskets. Also on the first floor is a well-euipped kitchen - and large room that can be used for meetings - a smaller room used as a library with books, a television, and confortable furniture - and an office. The first floor is used by Boy and Girl Scouts, many civic and fraternal organizations of the community - some religious services are held in the building by churches that are in the process of having their churches built or doing extensive renovations and alterations on their existing buildings.

The building is also used for pre-kindergarten groups for children of working Mothers - under the direction of the Resident Director and two adult helpers. Youth basketball for both boys and girls are scheduled - also sponsored parties for teenagers. To sum up - the building is used by - and is available for use by - all organizations and church groups of the community - and is one of the few existing facilities of its kind.

The second floor of the building houses a small apartment which is lived in by the Resident Director. There is a well-equipped playground on the property as well as an outdoors blacktopped basketball court (lighted) which was made possible by the East Hampton Lions Club.

The Association depends totally on contributions from organizations and individuals - a benefit golf day held at the Maidstone Club each fall - and from an appeal letter which is sent out each year - to cover the cost of maintaining the building and the grounds.....and make possible the programs.

The Association is registered with the New York State Board of Charities - files returns with the IRS - the Office of the Attorney General of New York State - as an organization exempt from taxes.

The Association has a Board of Directors - nine in total with a class of three exlected each year. There is a president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer and an Advisory Board of twelve members. The only paid employees of the Association are the Resident Director and the adult assistants who work during the school year with the kindergarten group.
