only been a few cases, and  
after it was supposed it was  
all over with, two more cases  
came down with it, Alice  
has been quarantined, but her  
time is up tomorrow, also  
Kenneth. Alice & Evelyn found  
it pretty hard to be separated  
for a week. Our new library  
was to be opened, they had  
begun rehearsing for a play,  
card social planned for New  
Year's Eve, &c but of course  
every thing has stopped short  
now. I hear there are cases

in East Hampton. Wasn't that a  
terrible accident poor Dan had! He  
is getting on as well as possible now.  
Think he has recovered faster ever since  
the Drs. amputated one toe. He goes out  
doors now on crutches. I want him to  
come here for a little visit when he is  
able, will be a little change for him.  
Of course you knew Hazel has been  
staying with Alice Perham and going  
to school since Mrs. Alice took her  
home with her after she made a visit

Here. Hazel came home with  
Catherine for holidays, and  
then Alice wrote them she didn't  
want H. to come back, she  
wanted some one who could be  
more help to her. Poor Hazel was  
awfully disappointed; she was  
doing nicely in school, and  
liked it so well. A pity for  
Alice to take her at all and  
not let her finish the term.

Lucia & family have been at  
Springs for two weeks. I have not  
seen them. Everyone says she has  
such nice children. I hear that  
Uncle Ward & Aunt E. are going for a
